The training is available using a number of delivery options designed to meet your specific requirements. These options are:

1. Day Release, 1 day per week.
2. Block Release, 1 week per month.
3. A combination of above with on-site training and assessment.
4. Open Learning training delivery with on-site training and assessment.

It is anticipated the program can take up to 12 months to complete

COURSE/CAREER DETAILS

This Australian Apprenticeship is designed to provide people who are entering the Outdoor Power Equipment Industry with specialist Small Engine and Machinery skills and qualifications.

This Vocation will involve many practical tasks including servicing and repairing outdoor power equipment for example: lawn mowers, brush cutters, lawn edgers, chainsaws, pumps, generators, post hole diggers, ride-on mowers and the like.

Trainees in most outdoor power equipment shops would be required to assemble and prepare machines for customer use and carry out minor servicing and repairs. They need good hand skills and patience when working with small complex motors and equipment. They will often work on two stroke and four stroke petrol motors and small four stroke diesel motors.

Some trainees may be required to have some customer contact and actually sell machines and/or replacement parts.

Trainees will be required to operate within a safe working environment. Good customer contact and communication skills are also an aspect of this Australian Apprenticeship.

This vocation can provide numerous career paths including:

- Specialising as a Qualified Outdoor Power Equipment Service Person
- Continue studying to gain Certificate III in Outdoor Power Equipment Qualifications
